Eyes of the heart . . .

As my reliance on God grows deeper, I hope to become a better servant day by day, a person of humility and kindness. My desire to serve the Lord through serving others has grown since my introduction to people less fortunate, many living in desperate conditions. To be of service is to "give myself away", at least that's what I call it, give to whatever or whoever has need for hope, kindness, or love.

Innermost thoughts are quite important, whether I am alone or with others. Are my thoughts loving, healing, encouraging, or are they sad, confused or bleak? Paying attention to my thought process is crucial; to be able to observe the natural flow of my mind is essential, not being disturbed or distracted. What exists in thought guides my decisions, my action, and sets the tone for that day. Whatever my thought or mood, if negative, no worries, because "greater is He who is in me than he who is in the world (I John 4:4)" and "I can do ALL things through Christ who strengthens me (Philippians 4:13)." The scripture becomes alive when I speak it. I count on that to get me through the rough days! Just as I am, I will accept myself. I will accept the reality that I am beautifully and wonderfully made, and thank God for *tenderly* loving me. I will accept the world just the way it is, but pray for a brighter and more compassionate world tomorrow. Whether I am advising students, affirming an inmate's worth, or serving the disadvantaged in Calcutta or West Africa, I am a servant and my job is to learn to be an effective one for God's purposes.

Each day I ask God to let me see everything as if for the first time; to see this world, to see my family, and to see strangers through the eyes of compassion. I remind myself that this person or that person has feelings and needs, just like me; remind myself that they have a soul, that they have a spirit, just like me. Remind myself that they yearn for a deeper understanding of themselves and of the Divine, just like me. Please dear Lord, let me be renewed in your ways, help me to understand and know what you will have for me to do today.

Just the other day, while studying scripture, Ephesians 1 struck me deeply, especially Ephesians 1:18. "I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened, so that you may know His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints." . The "enlightened heart"; we often refer to our mind being enlightened, but here Paul speaks of the HEART! Enlightenment refers to openness, understanding, or to brighten, to illuminate, or to teach. Therefore, to know God's calling I must enlighten my heart toward teachings of God, and to do that I must quiet my thoughts and my mind before God. Those times set aside to seek the Lord I deeply cherish; I find that the less I do or say the more I hear and learn, the more our Spirits (God's and mine) embrace. Embrace may sound way too intimate, but give it a chance, and in a few days, weeks or months, you will agree, "embrace" is the correct definition.

Quieting my mind I am now able to hear with spiritual ears and to anticipate what is to be my calling for this day, just today. Today I will see everything anew, today I will allow quietness of spirit, and today I will understand that everyone is doing the best they can from their own awareness. Rather than having today all about me, I will seek to do what the Lord has set before me for others. Today I will try to keep my intention on the connectedness of all things, all persons. I will try to remember that the "eyes of the heart" of this world will be enlightened by its Creator. Quieting the mind before God seems like a huge undertaking, trust me it is not. Be soft, be gentle with yourself. Make this a time of priority and set aside once a day, once a week, or once a month, just you and God, no interruptions. Liv Larson Andrews, the keynote speaker, Allison Ramsey, the synod office manager, Ely Smith, CWO WELCA treasurer who is from the Southwestern Washington Synodical Women's Organization and the unit voting members who attended the Convention/Bible Study Event.

The Region I Gathering of Women of the ELCA will be June 24-25-26, 2016, this summer... the dates will arrive before you know it!! Northwest Washington Synod Women of the ELCA is the host synod and the place for the event is the Embassy Suites in Lynnwood, Washington. The theme of the event is "Empowering Women". Churchwide Women of the ELCA Awarded Nearly \$50,000 Grants

These grants were awarded to 18 domestic and nine international programs in 2015 to promote women's complete and total health—physical, emotional and spiritual. In Region I, two grants were awarded: **Safe Place** in Olympia, WA received \$1,500 for basic needs and advocacy for survivors of sexual and physical violence, ages 1-17. **St Joseph's family Center** in Spokane, WA received \$2,000 for their women's health programs, engaging low income women through art making and exploring emotions.
