St. Mark Community Garden consists of a one-acre garden grown for the Thurston County Food Bank, and 46 raised beds that are open to community members that have no garden space of their own. The Food Bank garden labor comes from church members and community gardeners that adopt raised beds for their own private use (in other words, YOU!) Unless you have a physical limitation, you will be approved to adopt a bed if you agree to volunteer 12 hours over the period June – September 30th. We require 3 hours each month to assure coverage over the summer. If you have a physical limitation that prevents you from volunteering but still want to utilize a bed please talk to the Garden Coordinator who can waive the requirement.

We have 2-hour work parties every other week on Saturday mornings beginning in May that continue through September. You may also come Monday – Friday mornings during the summer and work under the direction of the Gary Delozier, our Head Gardener.

Garden Guidelines:

1. All interested gardeners will be assigned a bed in March. They can start working there bed as soon as it is assigned.
2. Each gardener will go to www.stmarklacey.org and find the application form and the Garden Guidelines. They will fill them out and return via email or by paper copy to church.
3. Unless physically unable and approved by the garden coordinator, gardeners will be expected to perform 12 (twelve) hours of volunteer time – 3 hours per month for the months of June - September. Those who do not fulfill their volunteer requirement will not be invited to keep their plot the next growing season.
4. Pets are not allowed in the garden.
5. We are eager to have children participate in the garden experience and ask that parents supervise their children at all times when in the garden.
6. Plot users promise to maintain their beds throughout the growing season. This means that it is weeded, and produce is harvested when ripe.
7. Your plot may be amended with organic fertilizer.

8. You may top off your beds with the garden soil available near the raised beds.
9. You may use organic pesticides or herbicides but please use judiciously – even vinegar can ruin your soil pH.
10. **Planting restrictions: No sunflowers or other tall plants as they shade other beds.**
 - **No herbs in the garden – You can help yourself to our shared herb garden.**
 - **Please no pumpkins in the raised beds as there is not enough room – we will have an area to plant pumpkins and squash– just ask.**
11. Please keep your plants growing within your beds and not impeding the walkways around the garden. Stake up your plants so they do not fall over into the walkways.
12. If you need to abandon your plot, please contact Gail Frare, garden coordinator at 360-870-6267 or gatofrare@comcast.net so that your bed can be reassigned.
13. If it appears that a plot has been abandoned without notification, an effort will be made to contact the gardener and if unsuccessful, the plot may be reassigned.
14. If you will be gone on vacation for an extended period and want your produce harvested for the TCFB, email the garden coordinator.
15. If produce looks over-ripe, volunteers may elect to harvest the crop for the Thurston County Food Bank. **If you do not want your crops gleaned, please place a sign in your bed stating, “No Gleaning”.**
16. All weeds and plant material must be discarded on the north or south sides of the beds. There are wheelbarrows available.
17. **YOU DO NOT NEED TO WATER YOUR PLANTS** other than when planting and then watering them in. Automatic watering is provided. If you think your plants are too dry, notify the garden coordinator. This is the most ignored rule in the garden and is costly to the church so please abide by the rule.
18. If you notice anything in the garden that needs to be fixed (broken hose nozzles, unusual accumulations of water or leaks, garden plots extremely dry, etc.) please email or call the Garden Coordinator.
19. Please keep the walkway around your bed free of weeds.
20. At the end of the growing season you are responsible for cleaning out your plot. Loosen your soil and incorporate aged compost or leaves in it for the winter.

St. Mark Church and the Community Garden is not responsible for any accidents in the garden and you must agree to hold harmless the garden group and owners of the land from

any liability, damage, loss, or claim that occurs in connection with the use of the garden by yourself or any of your guests.
